

Dear Parishioners,

The Mass is the central and fundamental form of Catholic worship. It's the reenactment of the Last Supper, Calvary, and the Resurrection. God is worshipped, the Sacred Scriptures are read, and prayers are offered in adoration, thanksgiving, contrition, and petition. And the Mass just doesn't happen on Sunday, either.

Each and every day all over the world, but increasingly not in every church due to the worsening shortage of priests and therefore not on every weekday or Saturday morning, a Mass is being celebrated somewhere in a Catholic church.

So isn't that enough? Do you really need anything more? The answer is yes; it's enough, because Catholics believe that Christ himself instituted the Mass. In addition, though, devotions are a way of expressing your personal love of God.

Whether praying devotions privately at home, in a small group, in a church, or in a mission chapel, Catholics believe that they act like spiritual vitamins to supplement the primary and main form of divine communication -- the Mass.

Devotions are optional -- Catholics can take 'em or leave 'em -- but attending and participating at Sunday Mass or the Saturday Vigil Mass is mandatory. Yet the great majority of registered Catholics of our parish and most other church parishes in our nation and in our New York metropolitan area in particular, more than 78% of those who would refer to themselves as Roman Catholics, never attend and participate in Mass or only do so as a cultural (e.g., Easter Sunday, Christmas, Palm Sunday, and a day when none of us are obligated to attend and participate at Mass, namely, Ash Wednesday) or social event for a family member's or friend's Baptism at Mass, First Communion, Confirmation with Mass, Marriage within Mass, or Mass of Christian Burial (i.e., funeral Mass).

I type this bulletin letter to people who do attend Mass, at least on this July weekend, and so I am "preaching to the choir," as the saying goes. Meanwhile, many so-called "Catholic Christians" remain at home or attend other activities such as Little League and hockey games or soccer matches for their children on Sunday mornings and often blithely ignore their obligation to worship God with us for just between 50 to 70 minutes a week. Others merely lounge around the house, making Sunday morning the day of rest it should be, but without communal worship of God with others at church.

Yet, of course, there are those with a valid excuse like debilitating old age, serious illness, a blinding or a crippling snowstorm or ice storm or flooding, military service overseas, double shifts at necessary round-the-clock work such as law enforcement or hospital nursing, or some such, who must miss weekend Mass, but are encouraged then to attend and participate at a weekday Mass in its place whenever possible. Those mentioned above who find convenient excuses they usually call reasons for missing weekend Mass for no truly valid cause are objectively living in a state of serious, "mortal" sin with the most grave danger to their immortal souls.

Anyway, to end more cheerily, have a fine midsummer July weekend and week until next Sunday or Saturday evening!
