Dear Parishioners,

On January 22 of this year we observed the fortieth anniversary of the infamous United States Supreme Court ruling providing for legalized abortion, *Roe vs. Wade*.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states the following, in part, regarding abortion:

2270 - Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person --- among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life.

2271 - Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortions willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law.

2272 - Formal cooperation in an abortion constitutes a grave offense. The Church attaches the canonical penalty of excommunication to this crime against human life. "A person who procures a completed abortion incurs excommunication latae sententiae ("by the very commission of the offense") and subject to the conditions provided by Canon Law.

2273 - The inalienable right to life of every innocent human individual is a constitutive element of a civil society and its legislation.

2274 - Since it must be treated from conception as a person, the embryo must be defended in its integrity, cared for, and healed, as far as possible, like any other human being.


