The days of fast (only one full meal) and abstinence (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Dispensations are granted only for those who are sick. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat). Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast (only one full meal). From the age of 14, people are also obliged to abstain (no meat).






Healing Hearts Support Group – New Session For Separated and divorced adults





1/2 tsp. salt


4 cups flour

Place yeast, sugar & warm water in a large bowl and let stand. Add flour & salt, mix well and knead to form smooth ball.




into a pretzel and place on baking sheet, brush with water and sprinkle with kosher salt. Let rise slightly and bake at 425° about 12-15 minutes.
