SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

God ordered Abraham to take his beloved only son to Moriah and offer him as a sacrifice. Abraham built an altar and took out a knife to sacrifice his son Isaac. Gospel: Mark 9:2-10



The days of fast (only one full meal) and abstinence (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Dispensations are granted only for those who are sick. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat). Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast (only one full meal). From the age of 14, people are also obliged to abstain (no meat).

IN ACTION - Outreach to the Poor and Vulnerable

<u>Diocesan Parish Counseling Services</u>: Parishioners have access to short term counseling (up to 6 sessions) at locations throughout the Diocese. The program was developed by Catholic Charities and the Diocese of Trenton. Licensed counseling professionals are available to help parishioners through difficult issues such as marital problems, raising children, eldercare, bereavement or the stress of job loss that can be successfully addressed by brief counseling support.

<u>Parish Emergency Assistance Program (PEAP)</u>: Emergency financial assistance to individuals through the parish and coordinated by Catholic Charities is available.

<u>Diocesan Social Service Workshops</u>: Information and resources to parishes and Catholic Social Service agencies are available to enhance Diocesan Catholic Social Service.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE.

As you may know, sadly the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act failed in the Senate. This Act was passed in the House of Representatives in October and would have been signed into law by our President, had it passed in the Senate.

Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Chair of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities is calling on you, the public to respond to the Senate, calling this vote "absolutely unacceptable". Here is his complete official statement:

"The U.S. Senate's failure to adopt the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, prohibiting abortions at 20 weeks post-fertilization, is appalling. Abortions performed in the second half of pregnancy usually involve brutally dismembering a defenseless unborn child, while also posing serious dangers to his or her mother. The Senate's rejection of this common-sense legislation is radically out of step with most Americans. Opinion polls consistently show that a strong majority of the public opposes late-term abortions—including those who self-identify as 'pro-choice'. Furthermore, the United States is currently one of only seven countries that allows abortions beyond 20-weeks. The other six are North Korea, China, Vietnam, Singapore, Canada and the Netherlands. The Senate must rethink its extreme stance on late-term abortions. I call upon the public to tell the Senate that this vote is absolutely unacceptable."

Both of our New Jersey Senators, Menendez and Booker, voted "NO" to this legislation. Their contact information is shown below to help you to respond to Cardinal Dolan's call to action.


