Dear Parishioners,

*We shall never be able to grasp the mystery that is the divine trinity; we can only believe it. Illustrations might help, but they do not explain the mystery of it. For example, the illustration of three burning candles might help. Held close together, the three flames remain three. Join the three wicks and there is only one flame, but three*

*candles.*

*St. Augustine spoke of one mind penetrated by three dimensions: (1) memory -- Father; (2) understanding -- Son; (3) love -- Spirit. St. Irenaeus suggested a man with two hands; Son is left and Spirit is right. St. Patrick used the one plant of the three-leaf clover to describe for the ancient pre-Christian Irish the concept of one God in three divine persons.*

*Still, the Trinity remains a mystery. Every time we make the sign of the cross (i.e., when we make the sign of the cross from head to chest to shoulders we cross ourselves -- we do not "bless" ourselves) we proclaim our faith in the Trinity, while voicing our hope of eventually entering fully into that great mystery.*
