Dear Parishioners.

This week we Americans celebrate our 236th Independence Day. Our so-called Founding Fathers were men who saw the need to declare and demonstrate our first thirteen states' freedom from political and economic reliance on the mother country of our emerging nation, Great

Britain. A Britain that is really "great" (in my opinion) because it has given us and some of its other former colonies to our immediate north and around the world a heritage of the importance of the rule of law, beginning with the seed of the Magna Carta on June 15, 1215.

Our Founding Fathers were the descendants of the men and women who influenced them, and the free-thinking intellectuals and essayists who inspired them. These representatives of the thirteen colonies, gathered in the central and largest colonial city of Philadelphia, declared their colonial governments as independent states and felt the need to be free to map their own and their constituents' political destinies without foreign influence, British or otherwise.

Those of trust in the Almighty, in God's "providence" for his faithful from Massachusetts' district of Maine to the southern border of Georgia, spoke and wrote of their reliance and faith in God's care for his people. The Founding Fathers of our nation convened in Philadelphia to represent their respective colonies' elected or appointed assemblies and people, eligible European-descended men who had the right to vote, as was the norm at that juncture in history. The most prominent of the leaders, from the businessmen and merchants of Boston and Philadelphia to the plantation and mill owners of Virginia and the Carolinas as well as some in between, north to New Hampshire and south to Georgia, saw the one God as their inspiration and their protector from the injustices perpetrated by a non-representative Parliament far across an ocean at Westminster in London, with an unelected, hereditary king at its apex.

Ours is indeed a Christian-principled nation, scripted and founded by educated men who were largely believers in a providential God, and deists rather than Christian in their personal religious beliefs. They were ever mindful of the historic fact that the first settlers at Plymouth and the Massachusetts Bay Colony, the first English arrivals-for-life on the coast of Virginia, the Quakers, the Mennonites, and other nonconforming European people of Pennsylvania, the refugeseeking Catholics of Maryland under George Calvert, Lord Baltimore, and even Puritan-persecuted Baptists led by Roger Williams from religious persecution in Massachusetts to found Rhode Island, came to freely practice their own particular faiths in the one God without interference from an official, "established" religious entity such the Church of England, i.e., the Anglican or Episcopal Church. We remember this on the Fourth of July, as we also recognize that many of the first Europeans came to pursue opportunities for freedom from invasive government interference such as we experience these days and much worse in the past and, naturally, economic prosperity as well.

During this time and all throughout our lives, let us all remember that it is "In God We Trust" and that we are "One Nation Under God." Let's not let our elected and appointed


