

Dear Parishioners,



In our diocesan newspaper, <u>The Monitor</u>, our bishop, the Most Reverend David M. O'Connell, CM, has most recently written about the need to seek, reach out, and encourage vocations to the priesthood and to the religious life of vowed men and women: Sisters, Brothers, nuns, monks, and friars.

The work I did in my "spare time" to assist the provincial director of vocations throughout my years of theological studies towards my master's degree during the last four years of the 1970s was shared by a classmate of mine. Ed and I were given lists of names and addresses of men who had contacted the vocation office of the eastern US province of the Society of St. Francis de Sales and who had asked for information about religious life and/or the priesthood. We two penned personal letters to uncounted hundreds of interested potential priests and religious Brothers all over the USA, men generally in their twenties and thirties. Most responded to our friendly letters by postal mail in the age before e-mail existed. A few went on to become Salesian priests or Brothers and more decided to apply for permission to begin preparations to discern whether the diocesan priesthood was their calling by God.

In the 18 years of my full-time teaching inside the classroom and youth ministry on and off campus outside the classroom at boys' Catholic high schools in Louisiana, New Jersey, and Massachusetts before I began full-time parish ministry in the Diocese of Trenton in 1997, I personally and informally encouraged some of the students I got to know to at least consider the possibility that they might have a vocation to the priesthood, either as a Salesian or as a diocesan priest. Most were surprised and some seem gratified, and almost all had never been asked the question before in their young lives.

I cannot remember a time when I myself first thought about becoming a priest, though the unspoken example of my dad's attendance at regular 8am weekday Masses during my elementary school years before leaving for his 11am to 9pm job every school day morning had a lot to do with the planting the seed of a priestly vocation for me.

During my summer assignments between 1969 and the early 1990s at summer camps, urban youth centers, and parishes, I sought out those young men I had come to know and had come to believe to have the qualities of good character and propensity for a priestly vocation and asked them, after getting to know them a bit through friendly everyday typically Salesian interaction, if they'd ever thought of becoming priests. Most of the ones I'd come to know and subsequently asked replied in the affirmative. Some went on to become Salesian seminarians and others later informed me that they'd been admitted to diocesan seminaries. A few today are priests, by the grace of God.

I say that love of one's neighbor nurtures a love of God among Christians, both Catholic and non-Catholic, just as Pope Benedict XVI says that religious or priestly vocations are born from openness to the love of God.

God calls men and women to serve him as priests, or as vowed women religious and vowed ordained or non-ordained men religious --- and the example of seriously committed and dedicated Catholic parents of most of those who go on to become priests, Sisters, or Brothers is most often the first and best means of nurturing and therefore gaining an increase of religious vocations.
