April 8, 2012 ALLELUIA HE IS RISEN



Dear Parishioners,

Easter is inarguably the holiest and most solemn and important day of the religious year for all Christians. Christmas may be the most culturally popular, but Easter is the paramount holyday of the Christian year.

I have fond memories of both holydays, and while I enjoyed Christmas more as any child raised in a practicing, religiously observant immediate family of seven would in the simpler days of mid-twentieth century America, I realized around the time of my Confirmation at the age of eleven by Newark Auxiliary Bishop Walter Curtis that Easter was somehow more important than Christmas itself. Everyone is born, though not of a virgin as Jesus was, but no one rises out of their earthen graves or mausoleums as Jesus did; at least not until the end days for all humankind.

Christmas Day was celebrated by my family in the Polish Catholic tradition, with ethnic religious blessings of homes by parish priests accompanied by altar boys during the last days of December on the cold streets of the Ironbound, "Down Neck," section of Newark, with Christmas hymns in English, Latin, and Polish alternately sung by adult and children's choirs, and with oplatki, ham, kielbasa, pierogi (the Polish equivalent of ravioli), and babka at my Dziadzi and Babci Galuszka's (grandparents) apartment around the block from Pulaski Street and St. Casimir Church with family.

Easter, however, was celebrated 10 miles away in Kenilworth, NJ, after Easter Sunday Mass at the home of my Grandpa and Nanny Devlin following the Easter morning Masses at St. Theresa Church with a large Irish-American oriented extended family gathering and a usual repast of goose, duck, and/or chicken, soda bread (the Irish equivalent of babka), more than one form of potatoes, and pies, including mince and rhubarb.

More than anything, Easter is the time of praising God, the ALLELUIA day and season, when we are rejoicing that God became a human being in the person of Jesus Christ, and died for our sins, allowing us to cooperate with his grace to eventually and hopefully fulfill our destinies of knowing, loving, and serving God in this world so as to be forever happy with him in the next. Happy & Holy Easter!

Parents with children in our religious education program should have received their re-registration forms **via mail for the 2012-2013** school year. Please make any necessary corrections and include the non-refundable registration fee (as instructed in the letter) by May 31, 2012.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE. NEW REGISTRANTS 2012-2013

The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade. To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- Family **MUST** be registered in Holy Family parish.
- Registration (**in person**) at the religious education office (located in the school).
- Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- A non-refundable registration fee as follows:
 1 Child \$100 2 Children \$150 3 or More \$180
- A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring. Grades 3 - 7 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
