Dear Parishioners,



Before Vatican Council II in the early 1960s, Catholics weren't allowed to eat meat on any Friday of the year, and the large majority of Catholics observed this directive. They also had to fast on all the weekdays during Lent. But the ill, pregnant or nursing mothers, and those who worked in hard labor jobs, as well as those in the military during wartime, were dispensed.

Going back even farther into Church history, Catholics weren't allowed to eat meat, eggs, cheese, or dairy products at all during Lent. Since Vatican II, however, the obligation is to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent and to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Even though the U.S. bishops received a dispensation (i.e., relaxation of rule for legitimate reason) from Rome for American Catholics to refrain from abstinence on every Friday, and not just during Lent, Catholics are strongly encouraged to do some form of penance, mortification, work of charity, or exercises of piety on all Fridays outside of Lent -- to show respect and honor for the Lord. This isn't often mentioned when the revised rules are explained, but it's mentioned in canons 1252 and 1253 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law. Recently, many bishops and pastors have been suggesting that Catholics abstain from meat on every Friday of the year in reparation for the sin of abortion and to pray for the defense of human life in all its stages and conditions.

2012 LENTEN REGULATIONS

The days of fast (only one full meal) and abstinence (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat). Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast (only one full meal). From the age of 14, people are also obliged to abstain (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of days, which must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year—often called "Easter duty"—for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 26th to Trinity Sunday, June 3rd. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

Catholics are encouraged to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.
