Dear Parishioners,

Envy, another deadly sin, is the resentment of another's good fortune or joy. Catholicism distinguishes between two kinds of envy: Material envy is when you resent others who have more money, talent, strength, beauty, friends,

and so on, than you do. Spiritual envy is resenting others who progress in holiness, preferring that they stay at or below your level instead of feeling joyful and happy that they're doing what they're supposed to be doing. Spiritual envy is far worse and more evil than material envy.

Some spiritual writers and moralists make a distinction between envy and jealousy. They maintain that envy is the resentment of what others have, such as possessions, talent, fame, and so on, whereas jealousy is the fear of losing what you already have. So a jealous husband fears that he may or will lose his wife to another man. If he happens to think Joan Rivers is the most beautiful woman in the world, than that same husband may also be envious of Joan Rivers' boyfriend. Jealousy is considered to be as much a sin as envy, because it closely resembles that deadly sin.

The Church maintains that meekness or kindness can counter envy. For example, Genesis 37-47 tells the story of Joseph's brothers, who were envious of Joseph, because he was the favorite son of their father, Jacob. At one point, Jacob gave Joseph an expensive multicolored coat, which pushed the brothers over the edge. They sold Joseph as a slave to a passing caravan after almost deciding to murder him. But Joseph rose through the ranks from slave to chief personal advisor to pharaoh; in effect, the pharaoh's chancellor or prime minister. Years later, when he met his brothers again, Joseph unrecognizably clean-shaven, perfumed, silk and jewels, and bedecked in while his brothers were bearded, longhaired, as likely as not unwashed, and dressed in woolen clothing. Instead of seeking revenge or retribution against his brothers, Joseph showed them kindness and generosity and brought them, their families, and his and their father into Egypt from drought-stricken Palestine. These sons of Jacob became the progenitors of the Twelve Tribes of Israel.



MERCER ALLIANCE TO END HOMELESSNESS

The Mercer Alliance to End Homelessness requests that the word be spread about the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) that many working families are eligible for but do not claim. As such we wish to advise you of the following:

- The Child Tax Credit is a nonrefundable credit up to \$1,000 per dependent child under 17 year of age meeting the following income criteria: (1) \$55,000 or less for married couples filing separately; (2) \$75,000 or less for single, head of household, and qualifying widow(er) filers, and (3) \$110,000 or less for married couples filing jointly.
- The Additional child Tax Credit (refund to taxpayer regardless of taxes owed) is for those who had a qualifying child and did not receive the full amount of the child tax credit. Qualifying for the additional child tax credit has the same qualifying and income guidelines. The Child and Dependent Care Expense Credit if for a working custodial parent(s) of dependent children under the age of 13 who incur childcare expenses and provides up to a \$6,000 credit.
- Some families can boost their household income by over 50% and tax filers can file amended returns for the two previous tax years as well. In fact, the Federal EITC lifts more children out of poverty annually than any other federal program.
