Dear Parishioners.

My favorite sci-fi novel has this singular quote: "Without change, something sleeps inside us, and seldom awakens." We all know that life is change, and the passage of time is its ever-present vehicle or carrier. Yet, the

vast majority of change in our lives are hopefully positive and not negatively incremental in nature. We have seen change in our parish with the death of a longtime beloved pastor, two temporary parish priest administrators, and now a fifth pastor. Our school closing, as well as the simultaneous mandated closing of two other Catholic parochial elementary schools within less than four miles of our parish, has resulted in change for our children that has caused distress and disappointment, but hopeful and positive plans for a better future as well. So, we've had to adapt, and adaptation is a form of change itself.

Nationally, the number of Christians who attend and participate in weekend church liturgies or services has been dropping for some time now, for Catholics, Eastern Orthodox, Protestants, and Episcopalians alike. Our new bishop, the Most Reverent David O'Connell, has recently initiated a study for the reasons of low Mass participation in the Trenton diocese in conjunction with Villanova University.

Culturally, our nation is undergoing a secular transformation, and one that seems to generally undermine traditional religious and spiritual values. We here at Holy Family Parish have seen no increase in numbers of the faithful registered as parishioners and at weekend Masses over the past 30 months, and this is a phenomenon that plagues the Catholic Church as a whole across the United States, with the exception of retirement-centered parishes in such places as Florida, South Carolina, Arizona, or our own diocesan parishes in Ocean County, New Jersey, Our weekend attendance numbers have remained steady at an average of 1,180 people at six Masses. So, starting this month of January, 2012, there will be one less Mass on weekends in our beautiful 510-seat church with a more practical partly-modified schedule, and in view of the upcoming needs of our 700 religious education students as we continue their instructions into the Faith. We will need existing church property for them when the parish has, in the not-too-distant future, closed on the sale of the parish's 16-acre Hazlet property.

Please continue to pray and support our parish, as many of you do, so that we will venture into a brighter, more vibrant future as the People of God in Union Beach and Hazlet.
