Dear Parishioners.



When the sick and injured weren't expected to survive, "Extreme Unction" was the sign that no more could be done, so the sick and injured were spiritually preparing for death. That's why even today, many of the elderly freak out when a Catholic hospital chaplain or parish priest brings his oil and

purple stole. They presume the worst and only see the sacrament as the beginning of the end.

In reality, the Anointing of the Sick is to offer prayers for possible recovery but the more important intention is to give strength to the soul of the sick person. Often, when people are sick, they get discouraged, depressed, angry, annoyed, and afraid. Some few, with extraordinary Christian faith and the recognition that God forgives their sins because they are truly sorry, do not experience discouragement, undue depression, anger, annoyance, and fear. The Church believes the sacrament offers a special grace to calm the spirit. If physical recovery is God's will, then so be it. If not, then the person needs the grace, strength, and encouragement to bear witness with dignity. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick also remits (absolves) all sins the person is sorry for but did not previously confess in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (i.e., Confession). On occasion, there isn't time for the person to make a confession, or relatives and caretakers of the terminally ill or very aged person unnecessarily wait for the very last moments to try to summon a priest to the bedside, although there have been days and sometimes weeks and months when the dying, incurably ill person could have been conscious or aware enough to speak and listen to a priest sacramentally anoint him or her. When the person is unconscious or not lucid enough to make a sacramental confession, the sacramental anointing compensates by forgiving sins, which the person would've hopefully confessed were he or she able to do so. Because of this aspect of forgiving sins, deacons can't sacramentally anoint, but priests and bishops can. (To be concluded...)




