First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

In this beautiful passage, a messianic prophecy, Isaiah exults in the coming of the Lord, who will bring justice and peace for all.

Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9

Paul reveals to us the necessity of living in peace and harmony. His words "Accept one another, then, as Christ accepted you, for the Glory of God" are as needed today as they were in Paul's own time.

Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptizer prepares the way for Jesus. Clothed in a garment of camel's hair, he baptizes the people in the Jordan River, but warns the Pharisees in ringing tones that they must give evidence that they mean to reform.

This Filipino practice dates back to the 17th century when farmers and fishermen celebrated early dawn Masses, so they could receive God's blessing before going to work. Through the years, Filipinos all over the world have adopted this tradition as a spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ on Christmas day.

Holy Family Church will host the Simbang-Gabi on Friday, December 13, 2013, by praying the Rosary in the Church at 7:00 pm followed by Mass at 7:30 pm.
