ELIGIOUS EDUCATIO REGISTRATION 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR AFTER MASS JUNE 23

Both new and re-registrations will be taken after the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Mass on June 23rd in Memorial Hall.

STUDENTS THAT ARE RE-REGISTERING <u>NEW DIOCESAN REQUIREMENT</u> <u>SIGNED registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each</u> <u>child.</u> <u>DO NOT MAIL REGISTRATION TO THE SCHOOL</u> <u>use P.O. BOX ONLY</u>. You may drop it off to our SCHOOL office May 6th thru May 30th, 9:30 am to 3:30 pm. Front door, ring bell. Fees increase June 3rd thru June 27th. Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 27th, your child will have to wait for the 2014-15 year.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE.

Classes begin on Tuesday September 17 and Wednesday September 18, 2013. No other notice will be sent home. Class assignments will be posted on those days.

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. Family <u>MUST</u> first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
- 2. Registration (in person) at the religious education office (At school).
- 3. Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.
 1 CHILD \$100 2 CHILDREN \$150
 - 3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$180
- 5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- 6. Grades 3 through 7 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
- 7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

""Why do you not give them something to eat yourselves?' They replied, 'We have nothing but five loaves and two fishes. Or shall we ourselves go and buy food for all these people?'... Then taking the five loaves and two fishes, Jesus raised his eyes to heaven, pronounced a blessing over them, broke them and gave them to the disciples to distribute to the crowd. They all ate until they had enough."

Although we gather at the Lord's Table weekly, once each year we are reminded of what makes us who we are, a Eucharistic people. The feeding of the crowd of five thousand was an extraordinary feat. Using the elements of five loaves and two fish, we are reminded of the widow feeding Elijah even though she had little oil in her jug and flour in her jar. There was enough for them for an entire year. The description of what Jesus did, surely is connected with our Sunday Eucharist.

The gift of the Eucharist allows us to have oneness with Christ and one another as members of His church. The sacrament is the sign of unity and bond of charity. It is not to be taken for granted, but appreciated as the source of life for us all. Jesus could do so much seemingly with little resources.

Following the super storm Sandy thousands rallied to feed, clothe, house and comfort thousands with what little they had. So much good could surface from a harsh experience. Victims of the storm were concerned for the wellbeing of others; even as they suffered from the disaster they shared their five and two.

We too are called to distribute the goodness of Jesus to others. What are your five and two? What can you give to the Lord and His people?


