Dear Parishioners,

The Holy See's "Instruction on the Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery" (promulgated in 1967 and later incorporated into the new "Code of Canon Law," #52, 57, 934, & 944) concerning tabernacles: <the holy Eucharist may be reserved only on one altar or one place in any church, and a vigil lamp must burn at all times to indicate and honor the presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. This tabernacle must be immovable, made of solid and opaque material, and locked to prevent theft or desecration of the Blessed Sacrament.> The tabernacle "should be placed in a part of the church that is prominent, conspicuous, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer" (Canon #938).

The "Instruction" further states "It is further recommended that, as far as possible, the tabernacle be placed in a chapel distinct from the middle or central part of the church, above all in those churches where marriages and funerals take place frequently, and in places which are much visited for their artistic and historical treasures."

For the above noted reasons, both St. Patrick's Cathedral in Manhattan and the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington have the Blessed Sacrament in tabernacles reserved away from the main altar.

The tabernacle was positioned in a prominent place at the east transept by the previous pastor, and there it remained for easy, visible, and close access for worship of the Blessed Sacrament for 29 years until an interregnum between pastors in 2008 and 2009. My predecessor as pastor saw to it that the Blessed Sacrament was placed in its proper reserved space in that transept, some dozen or so years after the relevant liturgical instruction was issued in the late 1960s. Mass was to be offered facing the people and in a language worshippers could understand after Vatican Council II, starting in the mid-1960s, but that crucial detail of the instruction was not implemented until after the departure of our previous pastor's predecessor.

The altar and its immediate surroundings are reserved for the Mass, and the Mass alone, the celebration of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. And, in the recently renewed spirit of simplicity and true meaningfulness exemplified and encouraged by our most recent Supreme Pontiff and Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis, the priest celebrant, deacon, altar server and other possible attendants will remain at their present positions stage left in the sanctuary, so as not to deflect attention away from the all-important liturgies of the Word and Eucharist.

'Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam' = (Jesuit Motto: 'For the Greater Glory of God'). 'Pax et Bonum' = (Franciscan Motto: 'Peace and Good'). 'Da Mihi Animas...' = (Salesian Motto: 'Give Me Souls...').

“GOING BACK HOME”



Physician-Assisted Suicide

What is at stake?

In October 2012, NJ Assemblymen John Burzichelli and Timothy Eustace introduced the so-called "Death with Dignity" Act. Modeled after similar state laws in Oregon and Washington, this legislation would allow mentally competent, terminally-ill adult state residents to supposedly 'voluntarily' request and receive a prescription medication to cause their death.

New Jersey

"Death with Dignity" Act A3328 / S2259

Would give a patient diagnosed with a terminal illness and given a prognosis of less than six months to live, the ability to request a lethal prescription to end his/her life. If passed physician-assisted suicide would become legal under New Jersey law.

Laws like these are Dangerous!

Suicide is always a tragedy

6 Reasons to Oppose A3328 / S2259

- ▶ A 6-month prognosis for a terminal illness can be wildly inaccurate.
- ▶ There is no requirement for a patient to consult a psychiatrist before receiving the prescription to commit suicide and many terminally ill patients are clinically depressed.
- ▶ There is no requirement for the patient to consult a palliative care or hospice expert.
- ▶ No physician is required to be present when the patient takes the lethal prescription.
- ▶ There is no requirement to notify family members.
- ▶ We should be supporting improved hospice and palliative care state-wide, not legal suicide.

KEY TERMS: Assisted suicide is the act of suicide with the help of another party. Physician-assisted suicide specifically involves the help of a physician in performing the act of suicide. Such assistance usually entails the prescribing or dispensing of controlled substances in lethal quantities that hasten death.
