Dear Parishioners,

By ordination, "priests are united with the bishops in [priestly] dignity and at the same time depend on them in the exercise of their pastoral functions; they are called to be the bishops' prudent co-workers" (CCC, #1595). With the bishop, priests form a *presbyteral* (priestly) community and assume with him the pastoral mission for a particular parish or parishes. The bishop appoints priests to the pastoral care of parishes and to other diocesan ministries. The priest promises obedience to the bishop in service to God's people.

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where he was not welcomed. He reprimanded his disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.

5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.

Since Our Lady is our Mother and Advocate, She always assists those who call on Her implicitly by praying the Rosary. The Church reminds us of this in the *Memorare* prayer, "... never was it known that anyone who fled to your protection, implored your help or sought your intercession, was left unaided ..."



NEW REGISTRANTS 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR

If you are a *new parishioner* and wish to register your children for our program, please call the religious education office at 732-264-7043 to make an appointment.

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

1. Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
2. Registration (**in person**) at the religious education office (At school).
3. **Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).**
4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.
**1 CHILD \$100 2 CHILDREN \$150
3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$180.00**
5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
6. Grades 3 through 7 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.

Classes begin on Tuesday September 17th & Wednesday September 18th 2013. *Re-registrations are now closed for the 2013-2014 school year.*

MISSION APPEAL WEEKEND JULY 13 & 14



Fr. George Berendt, PIME, will be coming to our parish to present the Mission Appeal on behalf of the PIME Missionaries the weekend of July 13 & 14. Fr. George Berendt was born in Detroit, MI. He was ordained a PIME Priest in 1974. His mission assignment was to minister to the people in Japan and returned to the United States in 1984. He has been working in many mission locations since then.

The PIME Missionaries are Catholic priests and brothers who commit themselves to lifelong missionary service, especially to non-Christians. (PIME stands for the Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions in Latin.) Founded in Italy in 1850, PIME is an International Society of Apostolic Life with members serving in Algeria, Bangladesh, Brazil, Cambodia, Cameroon, Guinea-Bissau, Hong Kong, India, Italy, Ivory Coast, Japan, Mexico, Myanmar, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, Thailand and the United States.

The priests, brothers and seminarians of PIME follow in the footsteps of the 18 martyrs of the Institute who stand as a constant reminder that the commitment to the foreign mission is for life. Their dedication is to: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the good news to all creation." Mark 16:15

Their activities are consistent with the diverse situations of the Non-Christian world, the priorities of the local Church and the current understanding of evangelization. They are engaged in the promotion of dialogue and understanding among religions and cultures, human development, justice, and peace. They're involved in the development of trade schools, hospitals and clinics, literacy programs, and the pastoral care of newly founded Catholic communities.

They provide many opportunities for individuals & organizations to become directly



involved in their ministry such as: Foster Parents – Adoptions at a Distance; Missionary Medical Relief; Native Seminarians; and Chapel Building. For more information log onto pimeusa.org.
