#### The Sin of Indifference



"Today no one in our world feels responsible; we have lost a sense of responsibility for our brothers and sisters. We have fallen into the hypocrisy of the priest and the Levite whom Jesus described in the parable of the Good Samaritan: we see our brother half-dead on the side of the road, and perhaps we

say to ourselves, 'Poor soul ...!' and then go on our way. It's not our responsibility, and with that we feel reassured, assuaged. The culture of comfort, which makes us think only of ourselves, makes us insensitive to the cries of other people, makes us live in soap bubbles which, however lovely, are insubstantial; they offer a fleeting and empty illusion which results in indifference to others; indeed, it even leads to the globalization of indifference. In this globalized world, we have fallen into globalized indifference. We have become used to the suffering of others: it doesn't affect me; it doesn't concern me; it's none of my business!" - Pope Francis

# The Living Last Supper April 14, 15, 16 from 7:30 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.

Come and experience the emotions of this living dramatization of Leonardo's "The Last Supper," where twelve men speak their minds to themselves, to each other and to the Lord, in the light of the tragic words that they have just heard Him speak. This presentation will take place at House of the Church of the Nativity, 180 Ridge Rd., Fair Haven, NJ.

Leonardo di Vinci in 1494 was commissioned by the Duke of Milan to decorate the dining room of the convent church of Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan, Italy. As an appropriate theme for this dining room, the painter chose the Last Supper. His painting was not intended to be a faithful reproduction of the original scene, but as it might have taken place in fifteenth century Italy. He chose what he considered to be the most dramatic moment of the Last Supper, that moment just after the Lord had said, "One of you will betray Me." Instantly the twelve disciples became men of twelve different moods. The only composed person was Jesus himself. For more information call 732-741-1714.
