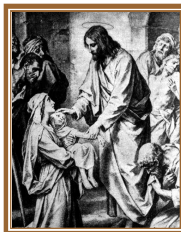

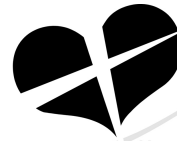

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this passage, Job laments the drudgery and pain all people sometimes experience in life. He talks of troubled days and restless nights. But he does mention that the days move along swiftly, which can remind us that our time here on earth is quite limited and should be well spent.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul explains to the Corinthians that he has no choice, but must preach the gospel. He tells of making himself all things to all people, in order to save some of them. He reminds them that he does this willingly, in the hope of sharing in the blessings of the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon and Andrew's mother of a fever, then others with illnesses or demons came to see him. He cured those who were ill, and cast out the demons of the others. Then he went off and prayed alone until his followers sought him out. Jesus and his disciples then moved on to other villages to proclaim the good news.

We ask that

you please register in the parish office anytime between 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday and between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Fridays. We hope you will become involved in one of our many ministries here at Holy Family. Please feel free to contact the parish office with any questions or concerns you may have at 732-264-1484.

Below are just some of the ministries you may be interested in participating in:

- **Adult Altar Server Ministry** – Assist our parish priest with funerals – usually morning hours.
- **Choir Ministry** – Do you like to sing? The choir practices every Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. in the church choir loft and sings at the 11 a.m. Mass each Sunday and on special Holy Days of the year.
- **Youth Choir** – Ages 7 to 18. Sings on designated Sundays at the 9 a.m. Children’s Mass. Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass for practice.
- **Altar & Rosary Society** – Women 18 and older are invited to join this ministry which meets every fourth Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. in Memorial Hall for prayer, taking care of the altar, fellowship, fundraisers, etc.
- **Compassion Ministry** – Assist those whose are grieving in choosing their readings and music and notating ways their loved ones are remembered.
- **Golden Age Group** – Young adults 55 and up are invited to Memorial Hall on alternate Monday mornings to join in fellowship, trips, bingo socials, and more.
- **Altar Server Ministry** – Grades 3 and up assist our Priests at Mass, Funerals, and weddings.
- **Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist** – Distribute the Eucharist during Mass.
- **Usher Ministry** – Assist in taking collection, seating, and greeting our parishioners and visitors.
- **Tarscisius Ministry** – Volunteers take Communion to the shut-ins and the hospital.
- **Religious Education Program** – You may volunteer as an aid, teacher, assist in baking goods for fundraisers, etc.
- **St. Vincent de Paul Ministry** – Volunteers assist in the food pantry, thrift ship, making calls to those in need, or delivering food.
- **High School Youth Ministry** – All high school aged teens are invited to join this ministry that meets every Sunday at 6 p.m. in Memorial Hall. Our teens get involved in service projects, fellowship, trips, fundraisers, etc.
- **Wednesday Adoration** – 8:30 a.m. to 3p.m. Come and sit in silent reflection before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament anytime from 8:30 until 3p.m. Cast all your cares on Him as He loves you so much!

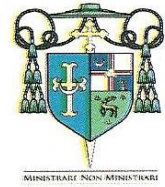

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

“These forty days of Lent, O Lord, with you we fast and pray.” This line from a popular hymn we sing in our parishes during the season of Lent contains a very important truth. During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from **Ash Wednesday, February 18th until Holy Thursday, April 2nd** --- it is with YOU, Lord, with YOU we fast and pray. The model Jesus gave us for “these forty days” was his own experience of the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. “With YOU we fast and pray” is our song. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. “With YOU, too, we fast and pray.” Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States asks of us as baptized Catholics:

1. The days of fast (**only one full meal**) and abstinence (**no meat**) are **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**.
2. All other **Fridays of Lent** are **days of abstinence (no meat)**.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to abstain (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of days, which must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called “Easter duty” --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 22nd to Trinity Sunday, May 31st**. However, the Church’s law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage Catholics to get to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance, grace and joy for us all.

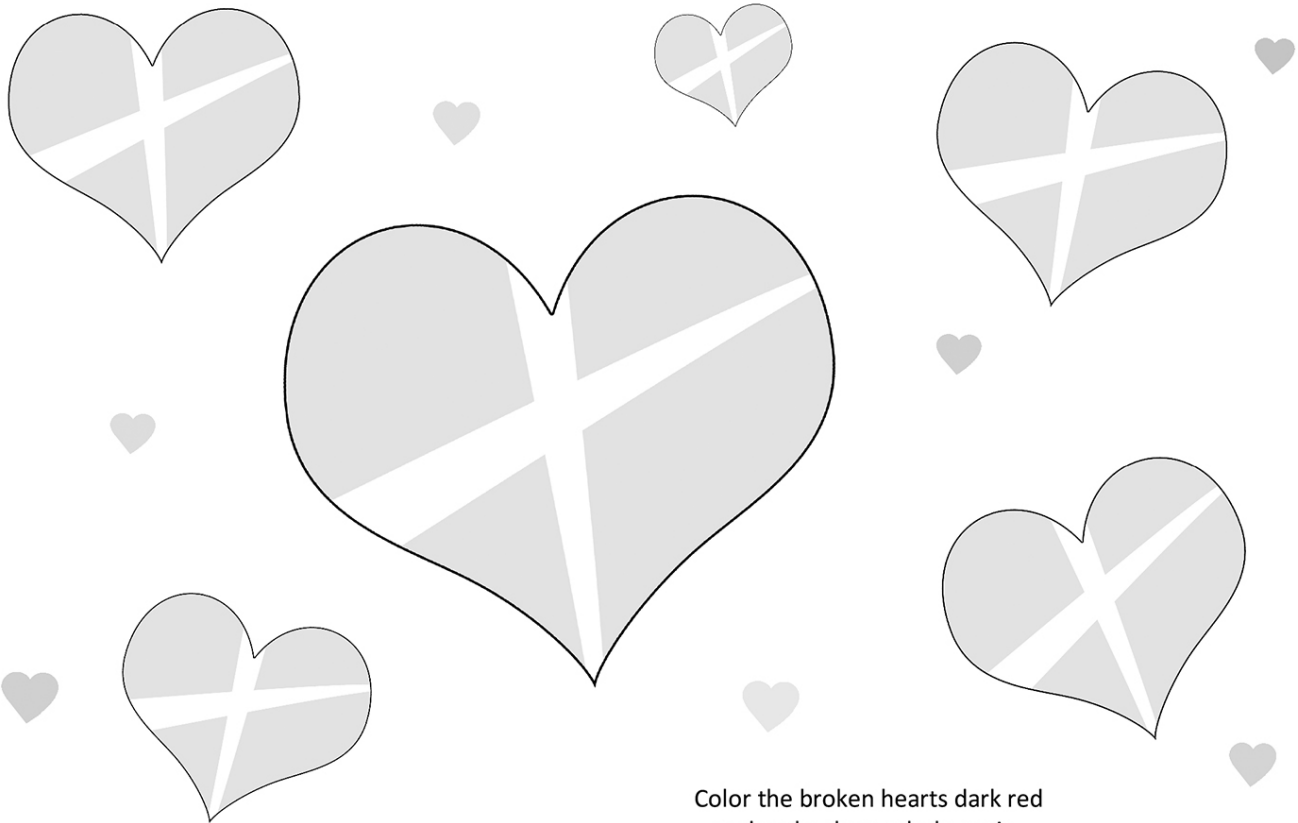
