Dear Parishioners,

I write to inform you of the decisions made by the Most Reverend David M. O'Connell, C.M., J.C.D., Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, pursuant to the recommendations of the Diocesan Planning Commission from the Phase One Planning of the "Faith in Our Future" Initiative.

COHORT 14: St. Joseph, Keyport; Jesus the Lord, Keyport; Holy Family, Union Beach; St. Clement, Matawan

1. Collaborative model for all four parishes in the Cohort
2. Merger Model for St. Joseph and Jesus the Lord, no later than July 1, 2018
3. Potential Linkage Model for Holy Family with the newly merged St. Joseph/Jesus the Lord to be determined no later than July 1, 2019
4. St. Joseph/Jesus the Lord designated as a Center for Hispanic Ministry, no later than July 1, 2018

On behalf of the parish and myself I offer thanks to our Holy Family Core Team, Craig Tonks, JoAnn Fortino, Mary Boncada and Edward Keenan who have prayerfully worked so hard over the past year as part of the Faith in Our Future Initiative. My gratitude also goes out to all of our parishioners who have prayed in support of this endeavor.

I ask for your continued prayers as we now enter Phase Two (Implementation Phase).

Parish Registration

We welcome you if you are a new member to the parish and invite you to register at the Rectory Office. We encourage you to share in a parish ministry program. You may register at Holy Family in a variety of ways including picking up the form in the rectory or filling the form out online and either mailing it to the rectory, dropping it in the collection basket or hand delivering it to the rectory.

Become a Registered Parishioner

One of the most important things that the people of a parish should do is register. Registering for the parish not only makes you more apart of the family of Holy Family and the Church it gives a chance for you and your family to be counted and heard in the parish

Some important reasons to register are the following:

Sponsor Certificates - when you are asked to be a sponsor for either Baptism or Confirmation you need a letter signed from your pastor stating that you are a practicing Catholic. If you are not registered in the parish, it is not possible for the pastor to sign these forms.

Marriage- For marriage preparation and marriage a letter may be needed from your pastor to allow you to get married in another parish or church.

Funerals- when burying a loved one in a catholic cemetery without a funeral mass it is necessary to get priest lines. Unfortunately the pastor needs to know if a parishioner was a registered member before he can officially sign the documents.

Mailings - You will receive all parish mailings with regards to special events and announcements.

Contributions - registered parishioners receive weekly envelopes to assist with the day to day operations of the parish. These are just a few of the ways that being a registered parishioner can make your experience a better one at Holy Family.

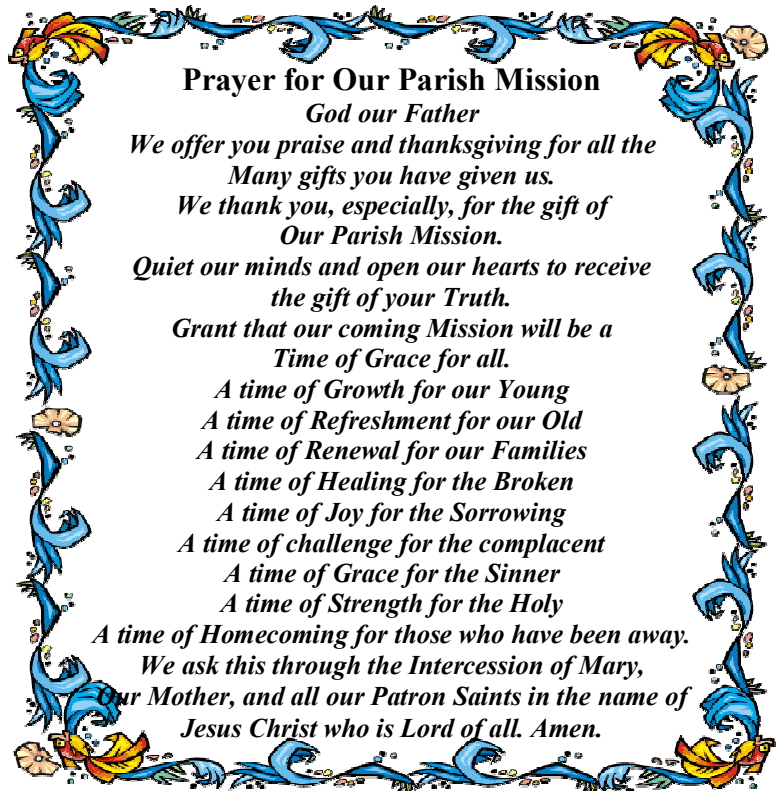

Church in Central and Eastern Europe**

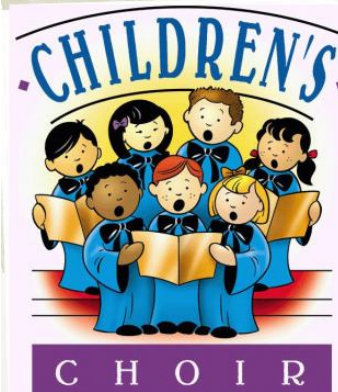

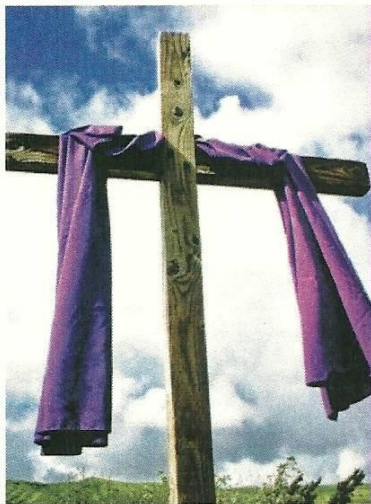
