**PASCHAL FAST – GOOD FRIDAY 4/14**

Good Friday is a universal day of fast and abstinence from meat. The Church of God fasts on Good Friday and Holy Saturday to honor the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus, and to prepare to share more deeply in the joys of the Lord's Resurrection with uplifted and responsive hearts.

**VENERATION OF THE CROSS – GOOD FRI. 4/14**

After hearing the passion of Jesus on Good Friday, we approach the cross to venerate it as the means of our salvation. The cross remains the greatest symbol of Christianity which has been revered and honored down through the ages. As we venerate the cross, we honor God who transformed this sign of death into a sign of forgiveness and life through the death of his son, Jesus.

During the Good Friday Liturgies, a special collection for the Needs of the Church in the Holy Land, in support of future priests, the works of the Holy Land and the upkeep of the Holy Sites will be taken in all Churches throughout the world. **BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD – HOLY SATURDAY 4/15**

Many Catholics around the world keep a tradition of fasting from Holy Thursday Mass, all through Good Friday, and into Holy Saturday when the fast is broken with "Easter Food" that has been blessed. The Blessing of Easter Food is a festive occasion. Decorated baskets lined with a white linen or lace napkin containing a small sampling of Easter foods, are brought to Church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. Eggs represent New Life in Christ; Bread represents Jesus the Bread of Life; Salt represents Preservation from Corruption; Meat represents Jesus the Lamb of God; Baked Goods, represents Jesus' Rising from death; Sweets represent Heaven; and Wine represents Joy of the New Covenant. The food is then taken home and eaten for breakfast or dinner on Easter Sunday.

**Bring your basket to the main church on Holy Saturday April 15 at 12 noon.** This is a wonderful tradition and we hope many parishioners and families will participate.



On this day of great rejoicing, Lord Jesus Christ, when we welcome you as our King and Savior, we also walk in the shadow of Your cross. Hosanna! We cry. Blessed are You who comes in God's name to save us. Hosanna! Strengthen our faith on this Palm Sunday so that when the time comes to carry the cross we might still call out to You with heartfelt praise. Give us the grace and the courage to follow You This Holy Week from death to resurrection, from darkness to the fullness of light.





RE-REGISTRATION**

Parents with children in our religious education program will receive their re-registration forms **by mail for the 2017-2018** school year the week of April 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Fourth and Fifth grades will only be a summer intensive program, June 26, 27, 28, 29 and July 5 and 6<sup>th</sup> from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm with returning classes for Advent and Lent; and our 1<sup>st</sup> grade program remains on Tuesday afternoons, from September thru December/mid-January (TBA), same time 4:30-6:00 pm.**

Please make any necessary corrections, **SIGN** and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, **or promissory note (call to request) by May 31, 2017:**

**(FOURTH AND FIFTH GRADE PARENTS PLEASE SEND IN ASAP.) SIGNED registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each child. If mailing please list to the "Attn: PREP office" on envelope.** All 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders may hand it in to their teachers during their remaining classes. You may also drop it off to our church **REL ED** office (rear of church, first door on walkway, large parking lot) see registration times below. **CLOSED FRIDAYS Fees increase June 1<sup>st</sup> thru June 29<sup>th</sup>. Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 29<sup>th</sup>, your child will have to wait for the 2018-19 year.**

**NEW REGISTRANTS**

To register **NEW STUDENTS** in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

1. Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
2. Registration (**in person**) at the religious education office (Under the church).
3. **Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).**
4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

**1 CHILD \$ 110.00      2 CHILDREN \$ 160.00  
3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$ 190.00**

5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
6. Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.



The word **Rosary** means "**Crown of Roses**". Our Lady has revealed to several people that each time they say a Hail Mary they are giving her a beautiful rose and that each complete Rosary makes her a crown of roses. The rose is the queen of flowers, and so the Rosary is the rose of all devotions and it is therefore the most important one.

Rosaries can be prayed for a special intention and is a way to give reverence to God for all that He does for us. Rosaries can be prayed for positive experiences in school, for the health of a loved one who is sick or for other little children all around the world. You choose the intent and use rosary time to focus on that.
