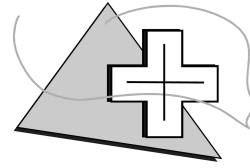

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 6:1-7

During the early growth of the Church, the apostles realized that they needed more disciples in order to carry out effectively the ministry of the Church. The community selected seven men, one of whom was Stephen.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9

Citing many uses of the word "stone" in the sayings of Jesus and in the Old Testament, Peter urges the Christians to be "living stones...an edifice of spirit."

Gospel: John 14:1-12

In this beautiful passage from the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, Jesus promises that he is preparing a place for the apostles. He tells them, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through me." When Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, Jesus answers, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father."

RE-REGISTRATION**

Parents with children in our religious education program should have received their re-registration forms by mail for the 2017-2018 school year.

Fourth and Fifth grades will only be a summer intensive program, June 26, 27, 28, 29 and July 5 and 6th from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm with returning classes for Advent and Lent.

Our First Grade Program remains on Tuesday afternoons, from September thru December/mid-January (TBA), same time 4:30-6:00 pm.

Please make any necessary corrections, SIGN and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, or promissory note (call to request) by May 31, 2017:

Signed registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each child. If mailing please list to the "Attn: PREP office" on envelope.

All Second, Third, and Seventh Graders may hand in re-registrations to their teachers during their remaining classes. You may also drop it off to our church P.R.E.P. Office (rear of church, first door on walkway, large parking lot) see registration times below.

Fees increase June 1 thru June 29. **Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 29, your child will have to wait for the 2018-19 year.**

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE. PLEASE READ YOUR LETTERS CAREFULLY!

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

1. Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
2. Registration (**in person**) at the religious education office (Under the church).
3. **Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).**
4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.
**1 CHILD \$ 110.00 2 CHILDREN \$ 160.00
 3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$ 190.00**
5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
6. Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.

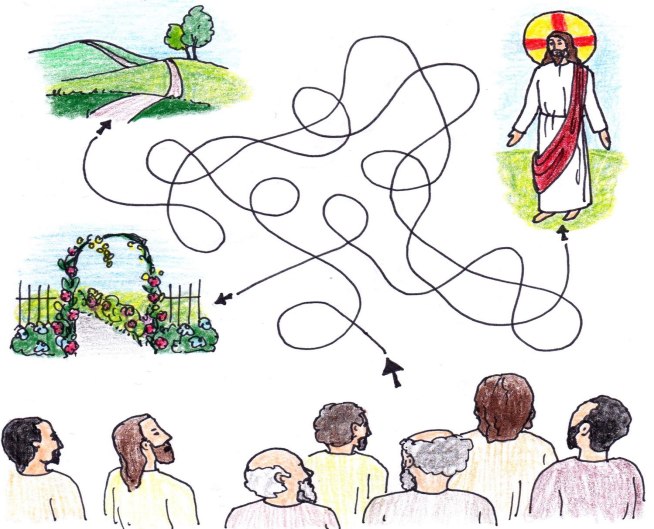

Saint Bernadine of Siena May 20

BERNARDINE WAS BORN AROUND 1380 IN ITALY. ORPHANED AT A YOUNG AGE, HE WAS RAISED BY PIOUS AUNTS. HE WOULD GET VERY UPSET IF PEOPLE USED BAD WORDS.

AT AGE 20 HE AND SOME FRIENDS HELPED LOOK AFTER PEOPLE DYING OF THE PLAGUE IN A HOSPITAL.

HE BECAME A FRANCISCAN BROTHER AND PRIEST, AND LIVED A QUIET LIFE FOR 12 YEARS.

Your wealth is entrusted to you by God!

ONCE HE WAS SENT TO PREACH A MISSION. HE SPOKE SO WELL EVERYONE WANTED MORE.

SO HE WAS SENT ALL OVER ITALY. HOWEVER, HE WAS STOPPED FOR A WHILE BECAUSE OF FALSE ACCUSATIONS.

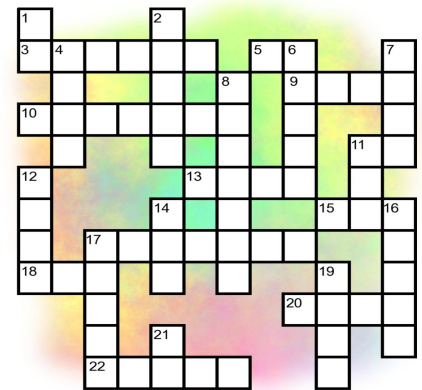
